#10-Montana at South Dakota for a key non-league game Nov. 9th

THE GAME: The 10th-ranked (*Sports Network poll*) **Montana Grizzlies** (7-2/4-2 Big Sky Conference) will play a non-league game, Saturday, Nov. 9, facing the **South Dakota Coyotes** (4-5/3-3 Missouri Valley Conference) in the DakotaDome (10,000). Kickoff is at 12:07 p.m. (Mtn).

GRIZ RADIO: Veteran **Mick Holien** is in his 21st season calling the play-by-play and the "Voice of the Grizzlies." **Scott Gurnsey** provides in-booth color, while **Greg Sundberg** serves as the sideline reporter. UM's flagship station is KGVO Radio, 1290 AM/KVWE 101.5 FM. (*Griz FB Radio Network listed on add 10 of the weekly release*).

TV: The Griz-Coyote game will be televised by **Max Media of Montana**. **Chris Byers** calls the play-by-play, **Ron Davis** provides in-booth color, and **Shaun Rainey** serves as the sideline reporter. The game will be aired on KTMF-FOX 23 & 42 in Missoula/Kalispell; KQYB-FOX 18 & 28 in Butte/Bozeman; KFBB-FOX 5 in Great Falls; KHBB-FOX 5 in Helena; KULR-NBC 8 in Billings; and KXGN-NBC in Glendive.

LAST GAME (Montana 51, at Sacramento State 48-OT): Quarterback **Jordan Johnson** connected with wide receiver **Ellis Henderson** for a 25-yard touchdown pass in overtime, and running back **Jordan Canada** rushed for a record-tying four TDs to lead the Grizzlies.

WINNING WAYS: Montana's win at Sacramento State gave the Grizzlies their 27th winning season in the past 28 years, starting in the 1986 season.

CANADA TIES RECORD: **Canada's** four TD runs ties him with four other players for the most in single-game history at Montana. The last player to rush for four scores was **Lex Hilliard** in a first round FCS playoff game against Northwestern State in 2004. (*See add 2-2-2*).

HENDERSON SHINES: **Henderson** had a career-high 180 yards receiving, along with 177 return yards, for a career-best 357 all-purpose yards in the Sac State win.

JJ HAS CAREER DAY: **Johnson** was 19-of-38-0 for a career-high 381 passing yards and 2 TDs against the Hornets. (His previous high was 354 yards at North Dakota earlier this season).

JPLEADS D: Linebacker **J.P. Kanongata'a** had a game-high 15 tackles. Free safety **Matt Hermanson** added 14 stops; LB **Brock Coyle** had 12; CB **Nate Harris** had a career-high 11. **Coyle** and **Hermanson** each had two forced fumbles, and **Hermanson** also recovered a fumble.

MONTANA'S POW NOMINEES: **Canada** was UM's offensive nominee; **Hermanson** was the defensive nominee; and **Henderson** was the special teams candidate.

USD SCORES TO DATE: at S. Dakota 10, UC Davis 7; at Kansas 31, S. Dakota 14; at #22-N. Arizona 22, S. Dakota 16; at W. Illinois 24, S. Dakota 10; at S. Dakota 17, Missouri St. 14; at S. Dakota 17, Indiana St. 14; S. Dakota 38, at #11-Northern Iowa 31 (2 OTs); at Illinois St. 28, S. Dakota 14; #10-Youngstown St., 38, at S. Dakota 34. **OF NOTE:** South Dakota's only loss at home this season was 38-34 last week to 10th-ranked Youngstown State. USD is 44-9 at home since the end of the 2003 season. Coyote head coach **Joe Glenn** was the head man at Montana from 2000-02, going 39-6, and his 2001 Griz football team won the Division I-AA national title.

LAST MEETING: Sept. 1, 2012 (at Montana 35, South Dakota 24): UM's two senior running backs led the way, as **Dan Moore** had career-highs of 27 carries for 148 yards and a touchdown, while **Peter Nguyen** had 10 totes for 192 yards and a score. The Grizzlies picked up a school-record 34 first downs in the win. (*Game stats & story on add 13 of the release*).

SERIES: The Griz lead 10-6, and have won seven of the last nine. UM is 2-5 in games at South Dakota. (*Year-by-year scores are on add 23 of the weekly release*).

MONTANA HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY**Second Year at Montana (12-8)**

Mick Delaney has a record of 12-8 in his second season as the head football coach at the University of Montana.

He is in his sixth season overall at Montana. Prior to assuming the head coaching position he served as UM's associate head coach and oversaw the running backs from 2008-11.

Delaney coached Peter Nguyen, who finished his career in 2012 ranked sixth in school history with 1,985 career rushing yards from 2009-11. He was also instrumental in the development of running back Chase Reynolds, who rushed for 4,067 yards and a school-record 52 touchdowns from 2008-10.

A veteran mentor, Delaney began his coaching career in 1964. The 2013 season is his 29th season of coaching football at the collegiate level.

Originally from Butte, he came to Montana from Colorado State where he was an assistant coach for former head coach Sonny Lubick for 15 seasons from 1993-2007. Former Griz head coach Bobby Hauck hired Delaney in 2008, and former mentor Robin Pflugrad retained him as he was the lone holdover from Hauck's staff.

While at CSU, Delaney coached some of the finest running backs in school history, including five first-team all-conference selections such as Cecil Sapp (2000). Sapp was a finalist for the *Doak Walker Award* as the nation's most outstanding running back and set a school rushing record with 1,601 yards in 2002. Sapp went on to play with the Denver Broncos.

Prior to coaching the Rams, Delaney was the head football coach and athletic director at Western Montana, Dillon, in 1991 and 92. He served as the athletic director at Montana Tech in Butte from 1983-85.

Delaney began his coaching career at Butte Central High School (1964-67) as head wrestling coach and assistant football coach. He also taught English at Central.

Delaney was an assistant football coach under former UM head coach Jack Swarhout from 1968-69. He was the head wrestling coach at Montana at that time as well.

He then moved on to Great Falls High School (1969-76) where he taught English and was an assistant and football coach (1974-77) and also served as the head wrestling coach. He was also an assistant track and field coach.

He was an assistant coach on Lubick's staff at Montana State from 1979-80.

He earned his B.A. in education at UM-Western (Western Montana College) in 1964. He is an inaugural inductee into the Western Montana College Sports Hall of Fame and was honored by the Montana Coaches Association in 1972 as the Wrestling Coach of the Year. In 1974 he was named the Football Coach of the Year by that organization. He also belonged to many associations during his athletic career including the Montana Coaches Association from 1968-present.

Mick and his wife Cheri have three children, son Mike, daughters Shauna Basile and Melissa Ossello, and nine grandchildren. His grandson, Mick, is a redshirt safety this season at UM.

QUOTING HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY:

ON THE SAC GAME: “It was a knock-down, drag-out fight just like we thought it would be. It was a real battle. We had chances to put the game out of reach a little bit, and every time in the second half when we had a two-score advantage, they’d come back and score twice and tie the game up. Our guys got the stop that they had to have, and that was in the one in overtime.

“Offensively we played very well. Jordan threw the ball well, Ellis had a huge game, as did Jamaal Jones, along with (wide receivers) Chase (Naccarato) and Cam (Warren), and of course Jordan Canada. It was a had-fought victory, and I am so very proud of our players and our coaches just to hang in there and keep fighting back, and fighting back.”

MISSOULA, MONTANA – UM's two senior running backs rushed for more than 100 yards each, as the 10th-ranked Griz defeated the in the season opener for the teams.

Dan Moore had career-highs of 27 carries for 148 yards and a touchdown, while fellow senior halfback Peter Nguyen had 10 totes for 192 yards and a score. The Grizzlies picked up a school-record 34 first downs in the win.

UM dominated USD in total yards (568 to 233) and first downs (34 to 9), but found itself in an eight point (24-16) deficit mid-way through the third quarter.

Montana led 16-10 at halftime, but the Coyotes, coached by former (2000-02) Griz mentor Joe Glenn, scored back-to-back touchdowns in a little more than a minute to take a 24-16 lead at the 9:47 mark of the third stanza.

On its first play of the third period quarterback Josh Vander Maten hit Terrance Terry for an 80-yard downtown bomb, giving USD a 17-16 edge. Just a few plays later safety Charlie Goro picked off a Trent McKinney pass and returned it 50 yards for another score to give the visitors the 24-16 advantage.

The Griz quickly regained the momentum, though with a bit of trickery, as on the their next series tight end Greg Hardy connected with wide receiver Bryce Carver for a 39-yard touchdown, cutting the USD lead to 24-22 with 7:11 left in the third.

Two series after Hardy's first career pass attempt and subsequent TD, the Grizzlies scored back-to-back touchdowns thanks to two straight USD turnovers.

The first USD mistake came when UM linebacker John Kanongata'a picked off a Vander Maten pass and the Griz took possession of the ball on the Coyotes' 34-yard line. Two runs by Nguyen picked up 20 yards, and then Moore broke free for a 14-yard scoring jaunt, and Montana led 28-24 with 4:49 remaining in the third stanza and would lead the rest of the way.

The Griz added an insurance score when sophomore defensive end Tonga Takai recovered a Coyote fumble on the USD 13-yard line. Three plays later Nguyen scored on a 3-yard run with 3:25 left in the third, in what proved to be the final points of the game.

Montana took an early 10-0 lead on a 21-yard field goal by redshirt freshman kicker Chris Lider and a 4-yard scoring pass from McKinney to senior wide receiver Sam Gratton. USD then cut the UM lead to 10-3 on a field goal by Kevin Robb with 10:33 left in the second quarter.

The Griz took a 16-3 lead on an 18-yard scoring strike from McKinney to junior wide receiver Cam Warren (his first career TD) with 6:08 left until intermission. An 8-yard Vander Maten to Terry pass made it 16-10 Grizzlies at the break.

The USD pick for a touchdown was one of the few mistakes that McKinney, a redshirt freshman in his first start, would make in the contest. The 6-0, 205-pounder from Mililani, Hawaii, was 26-of-32-1 (81.3%) for 214 yards and a pair of touchdowns, and he also rushed 13 times for 65 yards.

Gratton and sophomore wide-out Sean Haynes had a game-high 5 receptions each, while Carver and Nguyen had 4 grabs each. Warren had 3 grabs for 41 yards and a score.

The Griz racked up 315 yards rushing on 64 carries; ran 98 plays; had a 11-minute (35:57 to 23:03) edge in time of possession, to go along with their single-game record of 34 total first downs.

Junior linebacker Jordan Tripp led the Griz with 10 tackles, and also had a sack and a forced fumble. Kanongata'a added 8 stops, while senior linebacker Josh Stuberger added 6 tackles. The Grizzly defense held USD to 233 total yards (61 rushing) and 9 first downs.

MISSOULA, MONTANA (8/31/13) – Two of the premier teams in FCS football squared off, and the University of Montana Grizzlies came away with an impressive 30-6 victory over the Appalachian State Mountaineers in front of a record crowd of 26,293 in UM's Washington-Grizzly Stadium. It was the first ever regular-season night game in UM's stadium.

It was an impressive debut for the 20th-ranked Grizzlies, who racked up almost 500 yards of offense against a Mountaineers team (which had 328 total yards) that was 8-4 last season and returned 18 starters. ASU is making the move to the FBS next season, and because of that is not eligible for the FCS playoffs in 2013.

It was the first regular-season game under the lights for the Grizzlies, who jumped out to a 16-3 lead after an impressive first half in which they out-gained the 12th-ranked Mountaineers 272 total yards to 138, and had controlled the ball almost twice as much (19:05 to 10:55) time.

Montana took a 16-0 lead when junior quarterback Jordan Johnson connected with sophomore wide receiver Ellis Henderson on a 6-yard scoring pass, followed by junior running back Travon Van's 2-yard scoring run, and then a 25-yard field goal by sophomore kicker Chris Lider.

ASU finally got on the board when it marched 54 yards on five plays in the closing minutes of the second quarter, as senior place-kicker Drew Stewart nailed a 48-yard field goal as time expired at halftime.

Stewart cut the Griz advantage to 16-6 with a 21-yard field goal with 9:54 to go in the third quarter – which proved to be the only points scored by either squad in that stanza.

Montana, which is now 3-0 at home (and 3-1 overall) against ASU, tacked on two more touchdowns, the first on a 1-yard run by halfback Jordan Canada, and the second an 11-yard pass from Johnson to freshman tight end Jordan Harper. Harper's TD, which were the final points scored in the game, came with 9:23 left to play.

Van's first game at Montana was a stellar one, as the transfer from Marshall rushed 20 times for 118 yards and a score, while Canada was just as outstanding, picking up 112 yards and a TD on 25 totes. Montana rushed 52 times for 246 yards and two scores.

Junior quarterback Jordan Johnson was a very competent 19-of-23-0 (82.6%) passing for 251 yards and two touchdowns.

Sophomore wide receiver Jamaal Jones, a transfer from Washington, had a team-high 6 catches for 60 yards, while Henderson had 3 grabs for 72 yards and a TD.

UM's defense, which held ASU to no touchdowns, was led by its three senior linebackers, J.P. Kanongata'a (9 total tackles), Jordan Tripp (7 TT), and Brock Coyle (7 TT). Senior safety Bo Tully had two key plays for the D – recovering a fumble and grabbing an interception, and he also had 6 tackles.

ASU's quarterback combination of senior Jamal Londry-Jackson and sophomore Kameron Bryant were 21-of-33-1 for 205 yards. The Mountaineers gained 123 rushing yards on 26 carries. Freshman linebacker John Law and sophomore linebacker Kevin Walton had a game-high 12 tackles each.

The Mountaineers had not lost a season opener to FCS opponent since losing 22-10 at North Carolina A&T in 1993.

MONTANA 55, at NORTH DAKOTA 17

GRAND FORKS, ND – Junior quarterback Jordan Johnson threw five touchdown passes – three of them to sophomore wide receiver Ellis Henderson, as the Grizzlies registered a convincing 55-17 non-league victory over the University of North Dakota Saturday evening in front of 9,726 mostly partisan fans in UND's Alerus Center.

Both teams are members of the Big Sky Conference, but this was a non-league contest, as the teams had a home-and-home agreement before UND joined the Big Sky. The teams meet again next season in Grand Forks for a conference game.

Johnson was incredibly efficient, going 15-of-19-0 for the five touchdowns, and he threw for a career-high 354 yards. Those numbers gave him passing efficiency rating of 322.3 – a Big Sky record. It was Johnson's first career 300-yard passing game in 14 starts. His five touchdown throws tied him with several other players for the second most ever in a game.

Henderson had five receptions for a career-best 124 yards, to go along with his three TD grabs. Those three touchdown catches tie him for the second most in a game with several other players.

Montana (2-0) was incredibly consistent on offense, scoring on its first five possessions, and converting nine-of-10 third downs.

The game was full of big plays by the visiting Grizzlies, as they scored on five touchdowns of 30 or more yards, and had three over 50 — including a 70-yarder, a 52-yarder, and a 51-yarder. Montana's offensive domination was evident by its first (and only) punt of the game, which occurred with 6:02 left in the contest.

The Grizzlies' running attack was also solid, as halfback Jordan Canada rushed 14 times for 104 yards and two touchdowns, while fellow junior Travon Van had 10 totes for 72 yards and a score. It was Canada's second straight 100-yard rushing game and the fourth of his career.

Johnson hooked up with Van on a 70-yard touchdown pass, which ties for the 15th longest in school history.

UM's defense held UND's potent offense to 336 total yards (281 passing), while the Grizzlies had 609 total yards (376 passing and 233 rushing).

Junior defensive end Zack Wagenmann had three stops for loss and a pair of sacks, as well as 6 tackles. Griz senior linebacker Brock Coyle had a game-high nine tackles, while junior safety Matt Hermanson and senior linebacker Jordan Tripp each had seven stops. Tripp and sophomore cornerback Nate Harris each had an interception for UM.

UND (1-2) quarterback Joe Mollberg, a redshirt freshman, was 25-of-43-2 for 281 yards and two touchdowns, while sophomore wide receiver Jameer Jackson had 9 catches for 86 yards. All-American senior receiver Greg Hardin had 5 catches for 46 yards.

The win by Montana avenged a painful 40-34 loss by Montana at UND last season, in a game which UND had 704 total yards (and a conference record 660 yards passing), and scored nine points in the final two minutes of play.

The Griz had a big-play first half, with touchdown throws of 70, 53, 35, and 22 yards, with three of those TD passes by Johnson. The other TD throw was by wide receiver Chase Naccarato, which was the 22-yarder to Cam Warren. It was the first career pass attempt for Naccarato, a sophomore.

The teams play in Grand Forks for the third season in a row in a league game there in October of 2014.

MISSOULA, MONTANA -- The 9th/11th-ranked University of Montana Grizzlies scored on six of their first seven possessions and true freshman halfback John Nguyen rushed for 144 yards, as UM cruised to a 47-14 victory over the out-manned Oklahoma Panhandle State Aggies in a non-league game Saturday afternoon.

A boisterous (first half anyway) Washington-Grizzly Stadium crowd of 25,814 was on hand – the eighth largest in WGS history (196 games).

A lot of the starters for the Grizzlies played in just a handful of series in the contest, and the outcome was pretty much decided in the first quarter.

The game started with a two-play, 71-yard drive, with quarterback Jordan Johnson connecting with wide receiver Ellis Henderson for a 17-yard touchdown, as UM went up 7-0 in the first 41 seconds of action. Henderson's score was set up by a 54-yard run on an end-around play by wide-out Chase Naccarato.

The Aggies (1-3) held the Griz on their next series, but Montana then scored on its next five possessions, and when quarterback Shay Smithwick-Hann threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Taylor Walcott, who made a difficult, one-handed grab, UM took a commanding 31-0 lead with 1:43 to go in the first quarter.

Montana head coach Mick Delaney brought in his back-ups early, and all 63 players who suited up and were able to play saw action. The Griz tacked on another TD early in the second quarter on a 5-yard run by halfback Joey Counts to take a 38-0 lead with 14:02 left until halftime.

OPSU scored two unanswered touchdowns against UM's number two defense, making the score 38-14 at intermission. The Aggies' scores came on a 5-yard scoring throw from quarterback Caleb Holbrook to Tim Hollingshed, and a 1-yard run by 6-1, 258-pound sophomore tight end Kameron Young.

The Grizzlies shut out the Aggies, a Division II independent with an enrollment of 1,400, in the second half. OPSU was limited to 91 total yards and four first downs in the final 30 minutes of play.

Montana's nine second half total points all came in the third quarter, and all came via field goals, as Ben Worst nailed a pair of 41-yarders, and redshirt frosh Harrison Greenberg made a 21-yarder.

One of the highlights of the game was provided by Worst, a true freshman from Twin Falls, Idaho, who connected on a 50-yard field goal in the opening quarter. Worst, whose 50-yarder tied him for the sixth longest field goal in school history, made all three of his field goal attempts.

Johnson played in just four series and all were in the first quarter, was 3-of-6 passing for 59 yards and a touchdown. Smithwick-Hann was 3-of-9-0 for 29 yards and two TDs, while redshirt freshman QB Brady Gustafson went 2-of-4-0 for 40 yards.

UM had eight different players catch passes, and Henderson, Walcott, and true freshman tight end Jordan Harper had one scoring reception each. Nguyen had 22 carries for his 144 yards.

Counts and junior halfback Travon Van each rushed for a touchdown. UM's top two rushers, Jordan Canada and Travon Van combined for just eight carries and 17 yards. Montana rushed 45 times for 262 yards and two scores.

The three Griz quarterbacks' passing totals were 8-of-19-0 for 128 yards and three touchdowns. Sophomore QB Trent McKinney did not play due to an illness.

Sophomore linebacker Addison Owen had five tackles, an interception, and a fumble recovery. Junior defensive end Zack Wagenmann had 2.5 tackles for loss and a forced fumble in limited action.

Holbrook was 8-of-18-1 passing for 50 yards and the one TD pass. Sophomore running back Chris McClendon led OPSU with 57 yards rushing on 14 totes. Aggie linebacker Tanner Hallford had a game-high 9 tackles.

At Northern Arizona 34, Montana 16

FLAGSTAFF, ARIZONA – Northern Arizona University's Zach Bauman rushed for 118 yards and 2 touchdowns and the Lumberjacks returned two fumbles for scores, as they defeated the Montana Grizzlies in NAU's Walkup Skydome.

It was the Big Sky Conference opener for the teams, as the Grizzlies (3-1/0-1) suffered their first defeat of the season, and the Jacks (3-1/1-0) registered their third victory in a row.

It was the second straight win for NAU over Montana. The Grizzlies had defeated the Lumberjacks 14 consecutive seasons until losing this season and last year. It was NAU's first win over UM in Flagstaff since 1997 (27-24).

The Griz put themselves in a deep hole early in the third quarter, as cornerback Marcus Allen recovered a UM fumble and returned it 22 yards for a touchdown, giving NAU a 25-point, 28-3 lead with 13:59 left in that stanza.

Montana's offense struggled in the first three quarters, and scored its first touchdown of the game with 12:14 left, when Jordan Johnson tossed a 15-yard scoring pass to wide receiver Mitch Saylor.

After the Johnson-to-Saylor hook-up NAU kicker Andy Wilder connected on back-to-back field goals from 23 and 46 yards out, and his second three-pointer gave the Jacks a 34-10 advantage with 5:01 left in the contest.

The Grizzlies' final score came on a 9-yard pass from Johnson to freshman tight end Jordan Harper with 3:02 to go.

The Jacks took a commanding early first-quarter lead, as Bauman scored on back-to-back touchdowns on runs of 41 and 5 yards, his second TD run coming with 8:26 remaining in the opening stanza.

UM's only points in the first half came on a 42-yard field goal by freshman kicker Ben Worst with 5:20 left in the first quarter.

NAU tacked on another score on a 95-yard fumble return by linebacker Ryan Reardon with 2:03 left until halftime. That defensive score came after Griz quarterback Jordan Johnson tried to score on a 4th-and-3, but the ball was jarred loose and Reardon scooped in up and raced into the end zone for the score.

NAU led 21-3 at intermission. Bauman had 11 carries for 92 yards and his two scores in the first half.

Johnson was 17-of-38-0 for 292 yards and 2 TDs, but was sacked four times. Halfback Travon Van led UM with 45 yards rushing on eight carries.

The Griz defense was led by senior linebacker Brock Coyle with a game-high 13 tackles, while fellow senior linebacker Jordan Tripp had 8 tackles, including two for losses.

At Montana 55, Portland State 27

MISSOULA, MONTANA – The 10th-ranked Montana Grizzlies scored on five of their first six possessions, and the defense had a pair of impressive goal-line stands in a 55-27 Big Sky Conference victory over the Portland State Vikings in UM's homecoming game.

It was UM's eighth win in a row over PSU, and the Vikings have now lost 10 straight in Missoula.

In the victory, Montana also exhibited a power running game, rushing 47 times for 368 yards (and 17 first downs) – an average of 8.0 yards per attempt. UM had the ball for 34 minutes.

The Griz went three-and-out their first time on offense, but then ripped out five straight scores, and on the fifth – a 2-yard touchdown run by halfback Jordan Canada, they took a 35-13 lead with 8:16 left until halftime.

Senior tight end Clay Pierson started UM's scoring onslaught with a 36-yard scoring pass from quarterback Jordan Johnson with 12:22 to go in the opening quarter. It was Pierson's first catch of the season, and ended up with two more TD receptions in the contest.

After UM's initial score, PSU answered with one of its own, as quarterback Kieran McDonagh connected with running back Shaq Richard on a 32-yard touchdown pass. An errant center snap from center foiled the Vikings' PAT attempt, and the Griz had a slim 7-6 lead at 10:45 in the first stanza.

Montana took a 14-6 lead on its next possession as halfback Travon Van broke loose for a 42-yard TD run with 8:06 remaining in the first quarter. PSU fumbled on its own 2-yard line on its next series, and UM linebacker Jordan Tripp recovered the ball in the end zone for a TD, and UM took a 21-6 lead with 7:18 to go in the first.

PSU cut the UM lead to 21-13 on a touchdown pass, but the Griz responded with back-to-back touchdowns, on a pass from Johnson to wide-out Cam Warren, and Canada's 2-yarder, and UM took a 22-point (35-13) lead. The Vikings scored with 1:31 left until halftime, as the Griz led 35-20 at intermission.

UM's first big goal-line stand came mid-way through the second quarter, when PSU had first-and-goal at the Grizzlies' 5-yard line. Senior cornerback Anthony Goodwin had two pass deflections, and Tripp stopped PSU running back DJ Adams for a 2-yard loss, as the Griz held the Vikings out of the endzone.

Montana scored on its first four possessions of the second half, and jumped to an insurmountable 55-20 advantage with 9:02 left to play. The Grizzlies' scoring plays in the last two quarters were a pair of touchdown passes (25, 10) from Johnson to Pierson, and two field goals by kicker Ben Worst.

UM's other goal-line stop occurred in the middle of the third quarter, when the Vikings had a first-and-goal on UM's 3-yard line. On first down McDonagh rushed to the 1-yard line, but after short gain that he had an incomplete pass, Adams was stopped (by Zack Wagenmann) for a 1-yard loss, and then McDonagh was stopped at the 1-yard line on a tackle by Alex Bienemann and Wagenmann, and PSU was once again denied any points.

Van and Canada both had 100-plus yard rushing games. Van gained a career-high 136 yards and Canada gained 102.

Johnson was 12-of-24-0 for 203 yards and 4 touchdowns. Pierson had 3 catches – all three went for TDs.

Tripp had a game-high 10 tackles, a TFL, and the fumble recovery for the TD. Linebacker Brock Coyle and end Derek Crittenden had 9 tackles apiece. Goodwin had 2 interceptions and will remain among the FCS leaders in pass break-ups, as he had 7 PDs to go along with 3 tackles.

Adams rushed 18 times for 79 yards. McDonagh was 18-of-32-2 for 266 yards and two scores, and held to 13 yards rushing on just six attempts. PSU receiver Victor Dean, a 6-6 junior, had 4 grabs for 118 yards and 2 TDs.

MONTANA 42, At UC DAVIS 7

DAVIS, CALIF. -- Halfback Jordan Canada rushed for two touchdowns and wide receiver Ellis Henderson had two scoring receptions, and the defense was stellar, as the Grizzlies defeated UC Davis in a homecoming contest in Aggie Stadium in a Big Sky Conference game.

The victory improved the 10th/11th-ranked Grizzlies to 2-1 in the Big Sky and 5-1 overall, while the Aggies are now 2-1 in the conference and 2-5 on the season.

Canada, who rushed 24 times for 126 yards, went over the 100-yard mark for the fourth time this season and the sixth time in his career. Canada now has 19 career rushing touchdowns, which moves him up to seventh in UM history.

Henderson had 3 catches for 63 yards and two touchdowns. Griz junior quarterback Jordan Johnson was 12-of-20-0 for 163 yards and 2 TDs. Johnson's two touchdown throws today give him 38 in his career, tying for the eighth most in school history with Andrew Selle (2007-10) and Marty Mornhinweg (1980-85).

It was an impressive game by the Grizzlies on both sides of the football. The offense racked up 418 total yards, rushed 51 times for 255 yards and 3 TDs, and picked up 25 first downs. The Grizzlies also executed flawlessly, as they had zero penalties (UCD had four for 29 yards).

Montana's "D" held UC Davis to 237 net yards and 14 first downs, and registered four sacks. The Griz defense also intercepted two passes. Brock Coyle led UM with 7 tackles, while fellow senior linebacker Jordan Tripp added 5 stops, as did sophomore LB Kendrick Van Ackeren. Safety Bo Tully had UM's other interception.

UM junior end Zack Wagenmann had 1.5 sacks, giving him 15 in his career, which ties him with Randy Riley (15, 1993-96) for 13th on the all-time list.

Junior QB Shay Smithwick-Hann had UM's final score on a career-long 41-yard run -- his first career rushing TD, as the Griz took a 42-7 lead with 4:19 left. Griz halfback Travon Van had 11 carries for 59 yards and a touchdown.

The Aggies started the second half with a 9-play, 70-yard scoring drive, as QB Randy Wright scored on a 9-yard run to cut UM's lead to 21-7 at the 10:57 mark of the third quarter, but that would prove to be their only points in the game.

The Griz answered UCD's only score however, as Canada scored on a 1-yard run to give Montana a 21-point (28-7) lead again with 5:10 left in the third. UM added another TD on its next possession, as Canada, alluding several tacklers, raced to a 24-yard TD to put UM ahead 35-7 with 14:48 remaining in the game.

Montana scored in the closing minutes of the first half, as Henderson was on the receiving end of a 21-yard TD pass from Johnson, giving the Griz a 21-0 halftime lead. That late second-quarter scoring grab was set up by a key 3-yard scamper by Johnson on a 4th-and-3 moving the ball to the UCD 21-yard line, and then Johnson hooked up with Henderson on the next play for the touchdown.

The Griz "D" held the Aggies to 88 total yards and three first downs, and picked off two passes in the opening half. UM's offense gained 226 yards and had 15 first downs.

The Grizzlies got on the board first, when Johnson connected with Henderson for a 30-yard TD grab with 10:03 to go in the first, giving UM a 7-0 lead. Montana tacked on another score on its next possession, Van breaking free for an 18-yard touchdown run, giving his team a 14-0 advantage with 5:59 to go in the first stanza.

MISSOULA, MONTANA – The Grizzlies blocked a game-clinching field goal late in the contest and then put together a scoring drive in the last two minutes for an emotional overtime victory over the Mustangs.

The Grizzlies' last overtime game was a decade ago, a 43-40 double OT setback at home to Western Illinois in a first-round FCS playoff game.

Things looked bleak for the Griz and the 25,913 mostly partisan fans in WGS, as Mustang place-kicker Bobby Zalud lined up to attempt a 26-yard field goal with 2:17 left to play. However, Griz LB Jordan Tripp got his hand on the ball, and his block gave UM possession on its own 12-yard line.

After Tripp's crucial blocked three-pointer the Grizzlies, led by junior quarterback Jordan Johnson, marched 88 yards on 15 plays in 2:05 to score the game-tying touchdown. The game-tying play came on a Johnson pass to senior tight end Clay Pierson on a 4th-and-goal from two yards out. Freshman kicker Ben Worst then kicked the PAT, and the game was dead-locked 14-14 with 12 seconds to go in regulation.

Montana (6-1/3-1) got the ball first in OT, and on the second play Johnson completed a pass to Ellis Henderson for a 23-yard touchdown and what proved to be the winning score.

Cal Poly (3-4/2-1) quarterback Dano Graves' long pass on the Mustangs' third play in the overtime was picked off at the two by senior linebacker Brock Coyle.

Montana jumped to an early 7-0 lead on a 5-yard run by Jordan Canada with 5:38 left in the first quarter. The TD was set up on a blocked punt by Herbert Gamboa, which was recovered by John Nguyen on Cal Poly's 29-yard line. Nine plays later Canada scored from five yards out to give the Griz the early lead.

The Mustangs tied the game at 7-7 on a 6-yard run by fullback Akaninyene Umoh with 1:59 left in the first quarter. Umoh scored Cal Poly's go-ahead (14-7) touchdown with 5:57 left until halftime on a 4-yard run.

Neither team scored again after Umoh's back-to-back touchdown runs until the Johnson-to-Pierson 2-yard scoring hook-up which tied the game. That game-tying drive came on 15 plays for 88 yards, took 2:05 on the clock. Montana's offense wasted no time in the OT, scoring on its second play – the Johnson-to-Henderson 23-yard scoring strike.

It was a tale of two halves for the Griz, who were out-matched 247 to 78 total yards in the opening 30 minutes, and managed just five first downs, compared to Cal Poly's 14.

But, Montana's defense, led by safety Matt Hermanson and senior linebackers J.P. Kanongata'a, Coyle, and Tripp, made key stops when it had to in the second half. Cal Poly was held to nine first downs and 156 total yards in the last two quarters.

Hermanson had a game and career-high 18 tackles. Kanongata'a had 16 tackles and a forced fumble, while Coyle had 12 stops, 2.0 TFLs, and the game-ending pick

Tripp had 12 stops, a fumble recovery, and the key blocked field goal. Tripp's fumble recovery was the ninth of his career, tying him for the school record with LB Mike Rankin (1986-89).

Johnson was 22-of-39-1 (9-of-14 in the game-tying drive) for 242 yards. He had thrown 155 passes in a row until getting picked off late in the second quarter. Canada had 23 carries for 56 yards and a TD.

Cam Warren led the Griz with 6 catches for 47 yards, Canada had 5 for 38, Pierson had 4 for 25, and Jamaal Jones had 3 grabs for a game-high 96 yards. All four of Pierson's receptions were on the game-tying drive, including his 2-yard TD grab.

Cal Poly, which rushed 60 times for 308 yards in its triple option attack, was led by halfback Kristaan Ivory with 22 carries for 121 yards, while Graves had 14 rushes for 91 yards.

MISSOULA, MONTANA – The #10-ranked Griz hoped for another miracle comeback, but fell just short in a Big Sky Conference loss to the #3-ranked Eagles.

Last week the Grizzlies blocked a game-clinching field goal late in the game, and then put together a game-tying scoring drive in the last two minutes, followed by a TD on their second play in overtime for a 21-14 OT victory over Cal Poly.

Montana trailed EWU 42-17 with 16 seconds left in the third quarter after sophomore quarterback Vernon Adams threw his sixth touchdown pass of the contest, a 9-yarder to Mario Brown.

But, Griz QB Jordan Johnson and wide receiver Ellis Henderson hooked up on back-to-back scoring passes covering 7 and 48 yards, and Montana cut its deficit to 42-31 with 7:36 left to play.

After the Johnson-Henderson scoring pass had cut EWU's lead to 11 points, Griz senior safety Bo Tully picked off Adams on the Eagles' next possession, which gave Montana the ball on the Eagles' 31-yard line. UM went three-and-out after the pick, and then missed a field goal, and EWU kept the lead.

Montana scored its third touchdown of the fourth quarter on a 6-yard pass from Johnson to tight end Jordan Harper with 1:44 left in the game, and then Johnson's rush on a two-point conversion attempt ended up just a few inches short, and the Griz trailed 42-37.

After the Johnson-to-Harper touchdown, UM's on-side kick was recovered by EWU, and the Griz had no timeouts left, and the Eagles ran out the clock.

EWU scored on six of its first 10 possessions, and the sixth TD was the Adams-to-Brown score, which gave EWU a 25-point (42-17) lead late in the third quarter.

EWU then scored the only points in the third quarter, a 52-yard TD pass to Ashton Clark and the 9-yarder to Brown to take that commanding 42-17 lead, and which turned out to be the Eagles' final points in the contest.

Johnson was 26-of-44-0 for 349 yards and 4 touchdowns, and also rushed 11 times for 47 yards. He was just shy of his career-high, which was 354 at North Dakota earlier this season. Johnson has 22 touchdown passes so far this season.

Henderson had a career-high 147 yards receiving and tied his career-best with 8 catches. He now has 11 touchdown receptions this season.

Sophomore wide receiver Jamaal Jones had a career-best 7 catches for 77 yards, while Cam Warren had 5 for 66, and Chase Naccarato added 4 for 48.

UM junior halfback Jordan Canada rushed 12 times for 53 yards, and had a 28-yard touchdown run with 14:53 to go in the second quarter which gave the Griz their only lead (which was short-lived) of the game at 10-7.

Senior linebacker Brock Coyle led the Grizzlies with a game-high (tie) 10 tackles, and also had 1.5 TFLs. Junior free safety Matt Hermanson and senior linebacker Jordan Tripp had 8 tackles each. Tully and sophomore cornerback Nate Harris each had picks for Montana.

Adams, a Walter Payton Award candidate, was 27-of-40-2 for 457 yards and 6 touchdowns

Freshman wide receiver Cooper Kupp had 11 receptions for 182 yards and touchdown grabs of 19 and 34 yards. Clark had 6 catches for 80 yards and 2 TDs. Senior LB Ronnie Hamlin led EWU with 10 tackles.

SACRAMENTO, CALIF. – Quarterback Jordan Johnson connected with wide receiver Ellis Henderson for a 25-yard touchdown pass in overtime and running back Jordan Canada tied a school record with a record-tying four touchdowns to lead the Grizzlies.

The win also gave Montana its 27th winning season in the past 28 years.

It was a back-and-forth contest which featured six ties, and the sixth deadlock came with 23 seconds to go on a 5-yard pass from the Hornets' elusive quarterback Garrett Safron, to tight end Cole Hikutini, which knotted the score at 45-all.

The Griz won the coin toss prior to the overtime, and elected to start on defense, and the "D" held the Hornets to a 25-yard field goal, giving Sac a 48-45 edge in the OT.

Then it was time for the Johnson-to-Henderson game winner, which came on the first play of overtime for the Grizzlies. Henderson faked a move inside, and then broke wide open to the right side of the end zone for the game-winner.

It was the second time in the last three weeks the Griz have played an overtime contest. The last OT was on Oct. 19, and in that one, Johnson hit Henderson for a 23-yard TD on the second play of the overtime, and Montana defeated Cal Poly 21-14. Montana is now 8-3 in overtime games.

Canada's fourth scoring run, which tied him with four other players for the school record for the most touchdown runs in a game, was a 1-yarder on a 4th-and-goal, and gave Montana a 45-38 lead with 3:38 left to play. The Hornets put together a 10-play, 77-yard drive after Canada had given the Griz their second lead of the game, when Safron threw a 5-yard TD pass to Hikutini in the closing seconds of regulation, forcing the OT.

The teams combined for 56 second-half points, the Griz out-scoring the Hornets 21-7 in the third quarter, and then the Hornets doing the same thing to UM in the final stanza with a 21-7 scoring run. Safron's fourth scoring pass of the game tied the score up at 45-45 to force the overtime.

The game was tied three times (3-3, 10-10, 17-17) in the first half. It was 17-all at intermission.

Canada, who now has 12 TD runs this season, rushed 17 times for 78 yards. Johnson was 19-of-38-0 for a career-high 381 yards and 2 touchdowns.

Sophomore wide receiver Jamaal Jones had 7 catches for a career-best 143 yards and had a 54-yard touchdown catch – the first TD grab of his career.

Henderson had 5 catches for a career-high 180 yards. He also had 177 punt and kickoff return yards, and finished with 357 all-purpose yards.

Montana's defense forced four fumbles and recovered three of them, which led to 17 Griz points.

Senior linebacker John Kanongata'a had a game-high 15 tackles and 1.5 TFLs. Junior free safety Matt Hermanson had 14 stops, 2 forced fumbles, and a fumble recovery. Cornerback Nate Harris added a career-high 11 tackles, while linebacker Brock Coyle had 10 stops and 2 forced fumbles.

Safron had 505 total yards, with 412 passing and a game-high 93 rushing, and had two scoring runs. DeAndre Carter led Sac with 12 receptions for 165 yards, while Morris Norrise added 10 for 100. Linebacker Todd Davis led the Hornets with 11 tackles.

BAUMAN UP TO FOURTH: Northern Arizona's Zach Bauman moved into fourth place on the Big Sky's all-time rushing list with his 162-yard game against North Dakota. Bauman upped his career total to 4,813 yards, surpassing Portland State's Ryan Fuqua.

OVERTIME AGAIN: Sacramento State played its third overtime game of the season, falling 51-48 to Montana last Saturday. Since joining the Big Sky in 1996, Sacramento State is now 3-11 in overtime games.

Montana played its second overtime game in three weeks, winning for the second straight time. Montana has not lost an overtime conference game since 2003.

MCGHEE SIXTH IN TOTAL OFFENSE: Montana State senior quarterback DeNarius McGhee has moved into sixth place all-time in total offense in the Big Sky. McGhee has 11,573 yards of total offense after amassing 120 yards against Northern Colorado. Former Idaho great Doug Nussmeier is fifth on the list with 12,027 yards of total offense.

A CASE FOR THE PAYTON: Eastern Washington sophomore Vernon Adams, a candidate for the Walter Payton Award, continued his amazing season with 492 yards of total offense in the Eagles' win over Idaho State. Adams tossed five more touchdown passes, to hike his season total to 35. He is just two shy of the school record.

Adams is seven short of the Big Sky single-season record (42) set in 1996 by Montana's Brian Ah Yat.

SORE LEG?: Weber State's Tony Epperson has punted 78 times this season, just 10 shy of the single-season Big Sky record. Idaho's Ron Davis punted 88 times during the 1970 season.

EXTRA POINTS: Winning teams averaged 44.6 points per game on Saturday. **EWU (55) and Montana (51) both scored more than 50...**MSU's Cody Kirk rushed for 180 yards against Northern Colorado, upping his career total to 3,228. He is 418 yards away from the school record... UC Davis running back Gabe Manzanarez has rushed for at least 100 yards in three straight games and five of his last six...Road teams won four of the six conference games last week. Home teams are now 18-18 in conference games.
